ABOUT THE ADOPT-A-FIRE-STATION PROGRAM

Working in 24-hour shifts, stations are not only a workplace but also members' second home. Household items like washers, dryers, ice machines, refrigerators, and so on are used around the clock. When one of these items breaks due to heavy usage, a replacement is not covered by the city's budget.

The Adopt-A-Fire-Station Program exists to improve the working and living conditions for firefighters and paramedics for all 106 LAFD fire stations. This program gives community leaders like yourself the opportunity to directly support these stations.

Whether you give to your local station, a station that has helped a loved one, or an underserved station that does not receive a lot of support due to its location, **you will make a difference.**
